Abseiling - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students.

Students develop strategies to overcome physical and emotional challenges.

CARA Various sites around Tinaroo Students lower themselves down a cliff face with the aid of ropes and specialised abseiling equipment. Cliffs available vary in size to suit the ability and maturity of students.

Students are given detailed instruction in the skills and safety requirements – as specified in Education Queensland guidelines. Out teachers employ a "Challenge by Choice" philosophy in which pupils are encouraged to challenge themselves by progressing from a very basic slope up to a more challenging experience. Students are not forced to attempt anything, with which they are not comfortable.

# Canoeing / Sit on Top Kayaks: - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students

- Students will develop skills in supporting and encouraging each other
- Students will learn to make decisions and communicate with other students.
- Students will develop listening, organisational and directional skills.

## CARA -Canoeing activities

Students will utilise "Canadian Canoes" or "Sit-On-Top Kayaks" for transportation to activity sites. Some expeditions involve students paddling across the dam. Canoe stack may involve more than 4 students in a canoe.

Students will paddle in groups of 2, 3 or 4 persons in a canoe. At times the teachers will take the decision to link the canoes together and tow them single file. Students will wear a Personal Flotation Device (Life Jacket) at all times. A motorised Safety Boat always accompanies the group on longer trips.

Led by Qualified TEEC teacher plus two adult supervisors one of whom is a teacher who will accompany each group.

Dress code Sun safe clothing, sunscreen, hat, water bottle, closed in shoes that can get wet **Precautions:** A qualified canoeing teacher gives pupils instruction in basic strokes and safety and emergency procedures.









### Towed Canoe/Kayak Trip: - Suitable for all year levels -

- Students will develop skills in supporting and encouraging each other and working as a group.
- Students will learn to make decisions and communicate with other students.
- Students will develop listening, organisational and directional skills.

## CARA -Canoeing activities

Students: This activity is used as a means of transport to a variety of different activities around Lake Tinaroo.

**Students** are in canoes/kayak that will be linked together and towed behind the safety boat. Canoes/kayaks will be towed on flat water (wind speed of 15 knots or less). If wind is greater than 15 knots, an alternative program will be substituted. On the rare occasion when wind conditions increase during the day it may be necessary to return students to TEEC by safety boat or by motor vehicle. Students and adults will wear a Personal Flotation Device (Life Jacket) at all times.
