CARA Swimming Activities	<b>Students may</b> participate in supervised swimming if time permits on the program.	<b>Students will</b> be paired with a 'buddy' and will be instructed on the expectations of behaviour and activities. Adult supervision provided at all times.  A defined area will be identified for supervised swimming.	<b>Site</b> Black Gully or Barron River Campus.	<b>Led by</b> TEEC Staff, or support from school staff and accompanying adult/s	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, sunscreen	<b>Precautions:</b> Induction of rules and safe operating procedures. <p><b>Bushwalking:</b> - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students work co-operatively in small and large groups to traverse a variety of tracks</li> <li>• Students develop an awareness and understanding of the importance of working collaboratively and strategically to complete physical challenges.</li> </ul>
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CARA Bushwalking Activities	<b>Students will</b> explore rainforest, planted pine and dry forest environments.	<b>Students will</b> be paired with a partner and will be instructed on the expectations of behaviour and activities. Adult supervision provided at all times.	<b>Site</b> Various locations within the Tinaroo Dam environment depending on the focus of the activity.	<b>Led by</b> TEEC Staff, with support from Minimum of 2 adults (school staff and accompanying adult/s).	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, sunscreen Hat, Walking Shoes, water bottle	<b>Precautions:</b> Students are given detailed instructions for safe bushwalking. A mobile phone and first aid kit will be available on each bushwalk.
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<p><b>High Ropes/Vertical Challenges/High Activities</b> - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students work co-operatively in small and large groups to traverse a variety of rope bridges, foot cables, swings and ropes.</li> <li>• Students develop an awareness and understanding of the importance of working collaboratively and strategically to complete physical challenges.</li> <li>• Students develop competency with climbing techniques and the use of specialised equipment ie. ropes, knots, belay skills.</li> <li>• Students develop strategies to overcome physical and emotional challenges.</li> </ul>
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CARA Challenge – High Ropes/ Vertical Challenges/ High Activities	<b>Students Climb</b> up onto a linked course or standalone challenges. Students are in harness and helmet and attached to a safety line on course.	<b>Students</b> are encouraged to employ a “Challenge by Choice” philosophy in which they are encouraged to challenge themselves by learning a series of skills and progressing through a variety of elements at height.	<b>Site</b> Barron River and Black Gully Campuses	<b>Led by</b> TEEC Teachers who have the appropriate training as required by Education Queensland	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, hat, sunscreen closed in shoes	<b>Precautions:</b> At least two adults will supervise this activity. Students have a safety line attached on course. Safety and Emergency procedures are specified by Education Queensland.
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- **Abseiling** - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students.
  - Students develop strategies to overcome physical and emotional challenges.


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CARA Various sites around Tinaroo	<b>Students</b> lower themselves down a cliff face with the aid of ropes and specialised abseiling equipment. Cliffs available vary in size to suit the ability and maturity of students.	<b>Students</b> are given detailed instruction in the skills and safety requirements – as specified in Education Queensland guidelines. Out teachers employ a “Challenge by Choice” philosophy in which pupils are encouraged to challenge themselves by progressing from a very basic slope up to a more challenging experience. Students are not forced to attempt anything, with which they are not comfortable.	<b>Site /Off-site</b> Transport may be required	<b>Led by</b> TEEC instructors who have the appropriate training as required by Education Queensland.	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, closed in shoes that can get wet	<b>Precautions:</b> Student have safety line attached at all times, which is supervised by an adult.
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<b>Canoeing / Sit on Top Kayaks:</b> - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students will develop skills in supporting and encouraging each other</li> <li>Students will learn to make decisions and communicate with other students.</li> <li>Students will develop listening, organisational and directional skills.</li> </ul>						
CARA - Canoeing activities	<b>Students will</b> utilise “Canadian Canoes” or “Sit-On-Top Kayaks” for transportation to activity sites. Some expeditions involve students paddling across the dam. Canoe stack may involve more than 4 students in a canoe.	<b>Students will</b> paddle in groups of 2, 3 or 4 persons in a canoe. At times the teachers will take the decision to link the canoes together and tow them single file. Students will wear a Personal Flotation Device (Life Jacket) at all times. A motorised Safety Boat always accompanies the group on longer trips.	<b>Site</b> Various locations around Tinaroo	<b>Led by</b> Qualified TEEC teacher plus two adult supervisors one of whom is a teacher who will accompany each group.	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, sunscreen, hat, water bottle, closed in shoes that can get wet	<b>Precautions:</b> A qualified canoeing teacher gives pupils instruction in basic strokes and safety and emergency procedures.
						

<b>Towed Canoe/Kayak Trip:</b> - Suitable for all year levels - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students will develop skills in supporting and encouraging each other and working as a group.</li> <li>Students will learn to make decisions and communicate with other students.</li> <li>Students will develop listening, organisational and directional skills.</li> </ul>						
CARA - Canoeing activities	<b>Students:</b> This activity is used as a means of transport to a variety of different activities around Lake Tinaroo.	<b>Students</b> are in canoes/kayak that will be linked together and towed behind the safety boat. Canoes/kayaks will be towed on flat water (wind speed of 15 knots or less). If wind is greater than 15 knots, an alternative program will be substituted. On the rare occasion when wind conditions increase during the day it may be necessary to return students to TEEC by safety boat or by motor vehicle. Students and adults will wear a Personal Flotation Device (Life Jacket) at all times.	<b>Site</b> A number of locations around Lake Tinaroo are used depending on the program planned.	<b>Led by</b> As Qualified TEEC teacher plus two adult supervisors one of whom is a teacher who will accompany each group. The safety boat driver will hold the required licence.	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, sunscreen hat, water bottle, closed in shoes that can get wet	<b>Precautions:</b> adults and students are given instruction in emergency procedures. Students are given clear instructions about what is expected of them whilst under tow.
						

<b>Raft Build-</b> Suitable for upper primary and secondary students. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students develop skills to work collaboratively as a team</li> <li>Students develop organisational skills</li> </ul>						
CARA Black Gully and Barron River Campus	<b>Students will</b> build a raft and paddling around a defined course.	<b>Students are</b> given personal safety instructions, briefing and debriefing by a supervising teacher.	<b>Site</b> Various locations on Lake Tinaroo	<b>Led by</b> TEEC Teachers	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, Hat, closed in shoes that can get wet.	<b>Precautions:</b> Adult supervision with each group. A Safety Boat is available. Induction of rules and safe operating procedures eg. for carrying poles.



**Giant Swing:** - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students.

- Students develop strategies to overcome physical and emotional challenges

CARA Black Gully Campus	<b>Students</b> are harnessed into a giant swing. Their classmates work together to haul the participant to their chosen height where they release themselves to swing free.	<b>Students</b> Choose what height their companions will pull them to before or during they swing.	<b>Site /Off-site</b> Transport may be required	<b>Led by</b> TEEC Teachers	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, Hat and footwear	<b>Precautions:</b> Safety and Emergency procedures as specified by Education Queensland explained to students.
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**Catapults (C)** - Suitable for upper primary and secondary students.

- Teams construct catapults in preparation for a competitive tennis ball fight
- Students work cooperatively (learning and using a variety of knots and lashings) to construct an effective functional catapult

CARA Catapults – Other	<b>Students will</b> participate in teams, lashing together posts to construct catapults before tennis balls.	<b>Students use</b> poles, knot tying techniques, ropes, giant elastic launchers.	<b>Site</b> Barron River	<b>Led by</b> TEEC Teaching staff	<b>Dress code</b> Sun safe clothing, closed in shoes	<b>Precautions:</b> Induction of rules and safe operating procedures eg. for carrying poles. Safety glasses provided for launching.
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**Bat Talk (S)** - Suitable for all year levels. Duration - Approximately 1 hour.

- Develop an awareness of the needs of Bats in the environment
- Additional charge per student for the session which is delivered in the evening usually around 7.30 pm.

CARA Bat Talk - Other	<b>Students will</b> participate in a talk focusing on Bats and learn to recognise the importance of these flying mammals in our environment.	<b>Students</b> will gain a knowledge of the distribution, species variety and life cycle of bats. Experience a close look at a number of species of live bats up close. Learn about the rescue and care for sick and injured bats on the Atherton Tablelands region.	<b>Site</b> Black Gully or Barron River Campus.	<b>Led by</b> Tolga Bat Hospital.	<b>Dress code</b> nil	<b>Precautions:</b> External provider
